Gemini in Chrome

A great way to use Gemini in Chrome is to help you tackle tedious tasks. Let's say you're inspired by something you're seeing on the page you're on and want to take it into a brainstorming session. Without needing to leave your tab, you can use Gemini in Chrome to draft an email to whoever you want to share this with, include any info you want mentioned in the draft, and Gemini in Chrome will generate a draft for you.

You can click on "Send" right from the draft it generates, so you don't even have to leave the page to send it. This is one of the ways PinkPantheress used Gemini in Chrome to bring her ballet flats to life.

Downloading and Syncing Chrome

“Every device, whenever I get it, I download the same three things and Chrome is one of them.” PinkPantheress seamlessly syncs her accounts to maintain her passwords, bookmarks, tabs and more across her laptop and phone. Here’s how you can do it too.

1. Download Chrome on your phone, tablet or desktop:

2. Once downloaded, open up Chrome.
3. Click the Profile icon (your picture or a small silhouette) in the top-right corner.
4. Click “Turn on sync” or “Sign in to Chrome”.
5. Enter your Google Account email and password.
6. Click “Yes, I’m in” to confirm and start syncing your bookmarks, passwords, history, and settings.



Split View

Multitasking is a fact of life. Split view makes it simpler, allowing you to pull up two different tabs and navigate them both side by side, like PinkPantheress does here. With just a few clicks, you can easily view two pages at once, without needing to toggle between tabs. There are two quick ways to open split view on your desktop:

Right-click an open or active tab and select “Add tab to new split view”.

Right-click an inactive tab (one you’re not already on) and select “New split view with current tab”.
